Key Components

Science (S): The Impact of Hope on Emotional Health	<p>Scripture Focus: Romans 15:13 (ESV) "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope."</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Project: Create a presentation exploring the psychological benefits of hope and how faith influences mental health.
Technology (S): Hope Through Innovation	<p>Scripture Focus: Proverbs 23:18 (ESV) "<i>Surely there is a future, and your hope will not be cut off.</i>"</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Project: Develop a digital timeline showcasing technological advancements that have brought hope in challenging situations.

<p>Engineering (E): Designing with a Future of Hope</p>	<p>Scripture Focus: Jeremiah 29:11 (ESV) “For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Project: Design a model or blueprint for a community space that fosters hope and well-being.
<p>Arts (A): Expressing Hope through Creativity</p>	<p>Scripture Focus: Romans 15:4 (ESV) “For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Project: Create a visual art piece or poem that expresses personal interpretations of hope.
<p>Math (M): Measuring the Impact of Hope</p>	<p>Scripture Focus: Hebrews 11:1 (ESV) <i>“Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.”</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Project: Collect and analyze survey data measuring how hopeful people feel in your community.

Social Studies (SS): Hope in Historical Movements

Scripture Focus: Isaiah 40:31 (ESV)

“But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.”

- **Project:** Research a biblical figure who embodied hope during social challenges. How can we show it in our everyday life?
