

Exodus 16-20 Bible Study

Objective: This study guide explores Exodus chapters 16-20 through the interdisciplinary approach of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics, and Social Studies (STEAMS). By connecting the biblical narrative with various academic disciplines, participants will gain a deeper understanding of God's provision in the desert, the giving of the Ten Commandments, and the establishment of the covenant at Mount Sinai, all while emphasizing God's guidance and faithfulness.

Key Components

Science (S): Generational Patterns of Manna Gathering Behavior

- ❖ **Topic:**
Explore the consistent behavioral patterns related to the collection and consumption of manna over time, focusing on how environmental and biological conditions influenced these behaviors.
- ❖ **Projects:**
 - Sustainable Food Collection:** Study the Israelites' regulated manna gathering as an example of resource sustainability. Explore how these behaviors developed into a routine and affected community survival.
 - Behavioral Adaptation:** Analyze the pattern of behavior surrounding the collection of manna over time, examining how biological needs and environmental conditions shaped the consistency and adaptation of this practice in the wilderness.

<p>Technology (T): Preservation and Gathering of Manna</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Topic: Explore the methods used by the Israelites to gather and preserve manna in the desert, focusing on the technological processes involved in food collection and storage. ❖ Project: Food Preservation Techniques: Research ancient methods of food preservation in desert environments and compare them to the miraculous preservation of manna.
<p>Engineering (E): The Journey and Mount Sinai</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Topic: Examine the engineering and logistical challenges of leading a large group through the desert and the role of Mount Sinai in shaping Israel's faith. ❖ Projects: Journey Logistics: Create a model illustrating the logistics of moving thousands of people through the wilderness, including water, food, and shelter. Design Mount Sinai: Build a model of Mount Sinai based on the biblical description, analyzing the significance of the mountain as a place of divine revelation.
<p>Arts (A): Visual and Literary Reflections on God's Law</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Topic: Explore the impact of the Ten Commandments and God's covenant on Israel's identity. ❖ Projects: Art and the Commandments: Create artwork or literary reflections that illustrate the significance of the Ten Commandments in forming Israel's spiritual and moral foundation.

	<p>Literary Reflection: Write a poem or essay inspired by the Israelites' encounter with God at Mount Sinai, focusing on themes of holiness, covenant, and justice.</p>
<p>Mathematics (M): Calculating the Daily Manna Provisions</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Topic: Analyze the daily provision of manna for the Israelites and calculate the total amount needed to sustain the entire population over time. ❖ Project: Manna Provisions Calculation: Calculate the total amount of manna required to feed the entire population daily and for extended periods in the desert. Estimate the total amount needed over the course of 40 years.
<p>Social Studies (SS): Cultural and Ethical Context in Exodus</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Topic: Explore how the covenant at Mount Sinai shaped the Israelites' social, legal, and religious identity. ❖ Projects: The Role of the Covenant: Create a presentation analyzing how the covenant at Sinai transformed Israelite society and set them apart as God's people. The Ten Commandments and Society: Discuss the impact of the Ten Commandments on Israelite and Christian societies, highlighting the ethical and social implications of these laws.
