

Practical Leadership Bible Study

Objective: Leadership is not something we invent, it's something that is worked on and we discover through God's establishment. Each person is created intentionally, designed for good works, and called to walk in alignment with God's will. But how do we get to know what leadership truly is, especially in the constraints of our purpose.

This study explores how we are not confined by the limitations, but with an open mind, good faith and intentions, we find and live out our God-given purpose through discipleship and wisdom. Our purpose filled leadership begins with faith, while the Psalms remind us to seek wisdom and trust in God's timing. Living in our time requires courage, patience, and faith to follow where God leads.

When we align our talents, time, and heart with God's design, our purpose becomes more than a pursuit, it becomes a testimony of faith in action. How can we find our true purpose in life, one step at a time, following the path he has lit for us?

Key Components

Science (S): Discovering Leadership in God's Design

Objective:

- ☐ Understand that God designed every person with intention, equipping each person with unique gifts and responsibilities that reveal His purpose.

Scripture Focus: Proverbs 31:17 (NIV)

"She sets about her work vigorously; her arms are strong for her tasks."

- **Reflection:** Why does caring for your body reflect God's call on your leadership skills?

Technology (T): Tools for Uncovering Wisdom Objective: ☐ Explore what tools you need to live out your purpose in leadership.	Scripture Focus: <i>Proverbs 31:26 (NIV)</i> <i>"Listen to advice and accept discipline, and at the end you will be counted among the wise. Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails."</i> ● Reflection: How can we identify tools that help us receive the sound advice we need to find the leader in us?
Engineering (E): Building a Life that Honors God's Leadership Plans Objective: ☐ Consider how to "engineer" daily habits and systems that reflect God's purpose in your leadership, through prayer, service, time management, and goal setting aligned with faith.	Scripture Focus: <i>1 Corinthians 6:19-20 (NIV)</i> <i>"Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies."</i> ● Reflection: What repeatable habits can you employ to develop a healthy body that aligns with strengthening your skill sets.
Arts (A): Creative Expression of Peace and Joy Objective: ☐ Recognize creative expression as an exercise of discernment?	Scripture Focus: <i>Philippians 1:9–10 (NIV)</i> <i>"And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best..."</i> ● Reflection: How can we exemplify leadership through discernment, in our way of expression?

Math (M): Measuring Leadership Through Generosity Objective: ☐ Learn how generosity is a form of spiritual arithmetic, what we give multiplies blessings in ways that reflect God's abundance and one form of our measured leadership.	Scripture Focus: <i>Proverbs 19:17 (NIV)</i> <i>"Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will reward them for what they have done."</i> ● Reflection: How does giving with kindness create balance in your life? What does it teach about God's way of rewarding a cheerful giver?
Social Studies (SS): Discernment and Community Maturity Through Kindness Objective: ☐ Understand how true leadership involves helping others see clearly, make just decisions, and walk in alignment with God's principles, without unjust judgement, but through acts of kindness.	Scripture Focus: <i>Hebrews 5:14 (NIV)</i> <i>"But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil."</i> ● Reflection: How does discernment strengthen your ability to lead? In what ways can practicing discernment daily help you guide others toward righteousness and kindness?

Key Takeaways

This Bible study reminds us what true leadership begins with, which includes wellness, physical, emotional, and relational health. Leadership is defined by the alignment of His will, according to the discernment of scripture and through the faith that is interconnected between the goodness of love. When we cultivate habits of balance, kindness, guidance, diligence and caring, we embody leadership that reflects God's design: purposeful, disciplined, and rooted in discipleship.
