

Social Justice Bible Study

Objective: To understand and reflect on biblical teachings about justice and righteousness, fostering awareness, empathy, and action through interdisciplinary learning in the STEAMS framework.

Key Components

Science (S): The Impact of Justice on Society

Scripture Focus: Proverbs 21:15 (ESV)

"When justice is done, it is a joy to the righteous but terror to evildoers."

- **Reflect:** How does fairness and access to resources like clean water, healthcare, and education affect community health and stability.
- How does God's design for justice contribute to the flourishing of His creation?

Technology (S): Justice in the Digital Age

Scripture Focus: Proverbs 31:8-9 (ESV)

"Open your mouth for the mute, for the rights of all who are destitute. Open your mouth, judge righteously, defend the rights of the poor and needy."

- **Reflect:** Consider how technology can serve as a tool for spreading God's love and advocating for His justice.

Engineering (E): Designing for Justice	<p>Scripture Focus: Isaiah 1:17 (ESV)</p> <p>"Learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause."</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Reflect: How is God's call to justice like building a strong foundation for a community rooted in His Word?● How can you align your actions with His commands to seek justice and defend the marginalized?
Arts (A): Expressing Justice through Creativity	<p>Scripture Focus: Amos 5:24 (ESV)</p> <p>"But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream."</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Reflect: How does the beauty of art and creativity reflect God's justice and righteousness?
Math (M): Counting the Cost of Justice	<p>Scripture Focus: Hebrews 11:1 (ESV)</p> <p><i>"Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Reflect: Consider how God's justice is impartial, perfect, and unchanging.

Social Studies (SS): God's Justice Through History

Scripture Focus: Micah 6:8 (ESV)

"He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

- **Reflect:** Reflect on how God has used people throughout history, both in the Bible and beyond, to accomplish His justice.

Key Takeaways

This Social Justice Bible study invites participants to meditate on scripture, allowing God's Word to transform their understanding of justice. Through prayer and reflection, students grow spiritually and deepen their commitment to live justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God.
